

Proceedings of the Colo City Council  
January 3, 2017

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, January 3, 2017, at City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor John Wilson. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Conrad, Otto, Geisinger, Nichols, and Spalding. Absent: none.

Council member Conrad moved to approve the minutes of the December 5, 2016 regular meeting as presented. Council member Spalding seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The Council received funding requests for the fiscal year ending 6-30-18 from the following organizations: Colo Food Pantry, RSVP, Good Neighbor Emergency Assistance, Mid-Iowa Community Action, Salvation Army, Story County Legal Aid and ACCESS.

Geisinger gave a report on the Colo Fire Department. The new attack truck will be in service in January.

Joanie Jamison from the Colo Public Library gave a report. She stated a new janitor and library help had been hired. The Library is hosting an Ancestry.com event on February 4, 2017.

Council member Conrad introduced RESOLUTION APPOINTING REPRESENTATIVES TO THE STORY COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT GROUP. Council member Otto seconded the motion and it passed record vote: Geisinger, Otto, Conrad, Nichols, and Spalding. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution was adopted and he gave it No 17-1-1.

The council discussed the allowing UTV's and ATV's to be ridden within the City. Spalding moved to approve constructing an updated golf cart ordinance by adding UTV's and ATV's to the ordinance with certain rules and regulations. Council member Nichols seconded the motion and it passed with 4 ayes and 1 nay. Clerk Kohlwes is contacting City Attorney to construct the new ordinance.

Discussions on the housing development were made. More information is being gathered.

Bob Meyerhoff discussed with the council his high water bill do to a pipe break. He wanted the council to forgive the sewer usage. The council said no due to others in the same situation has always been charged the sewer fee.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Conrad moved to adjourn. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
