January 6, 2020

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, January 6, 2020 at City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Arlo Starbuck. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Geisinger, Spalding, Adams and Stoeffler. Absent: Handsaker

Council member Adams seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Story County Sheriff, Nathan Gruis told the council the City has been quiet. Year-end reports for the county came out, Colo is the most patrolled in the county.

Fire Chief, Dennis Clatt informed the council the department is down 19 calls from 2018. Terry Weltz is retiring from the department this month. Clatt is getting estimates for new walk-in doors for the station. Other items were discussed on what is needing to be replace in the next few years.

Librarian, Joanie Jamison said library activities are slowing down due to the upcoming Community Center renovations. Coffee and Conversations is Friday, the High School boys' choir will be performing.

Story County Supervisor Lauris Olson talked about things within the county.

Council member Spalding moved to approve the 2020 Appointments. Council member Adams seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The housing development was discussed. More information is being gathered from the city engineer and the land owner.

In other business, council member Geisinger recommended the council visit the Comprehensive Plan. All members are to come up with a wish list of what they'd like for the City.

The Community Center renovations are waiting on the architect's final drawings in order to move forward with bids.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Stoeffler moved to adjourn. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
