Council member Spalding seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Fire Chief, Dennis Clatt gave the council a year-end review. The department had 210 calls. 742 volunteer hours for training and calls. Discussion on what is needed at the fire department were made. Clatt is getting bids to finish the parking lot. Clatt told the council the 911 Board of Story County is gathering information on the purchase of new radios and pagers. The department finished up on their yearly state audit and everything went well. The department has gained a couple new members and three have retired.

The lift station control panel retrofit was discussed. Clerk Kohlwes is waiting on second estimate.

The council tabled discussion of a tractor or UTV. More information is being gathered.

The housing development was discussed. More information is being gathered.

In other business the council discussed moving forward with sump pump inspections. Inspections will be moving to the east side of town, north of the tracks.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Spalding moved to adjourn. Council member Stoeffler seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
