January 8, 2018

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, January 8, 2018, at City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor John Wilson. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Stoeffler, Spalding, Geisinger, Otto, Handsaker. Absent: none.

Council member Otto moved to approve the minutes of the December 5, 2017 regular meeting as presented. Council member Spalding seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Handsaker seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Colo Librarian, Joanie Jamison stated a yoga story time is currently going on for preschool aged kids. After school program will start back up in February. "Coffee and Conversations" is being held the second Friday of the month at 10:00 a.m. Ranger Luke from Story County Conservation will be January's speaker. A representative from the Story County Sheriff's Office will be speaking in February.

Story County Sheriff, Kyle Thompson stated activity has been slow.

2018 council appointments were discussed. A School Board appointment was added to the list. All agreed this will keep the school and city informed on what's happening.

Rodney Geisinger informed the council the Fire Department received a grant from the Iowa Department of Public Health for a Lucas Device. Geisinger also presented the council with a rate increase for Fire/EMS training and call attendance for their personnel. Council member Stoeffler moved to approve the rate increase to \$6.00 per training and \$9.00 per emergency call. Council member Spalding seconded the motion and it passed with all ayes. The rate increase will begin July 1, 2018.

More information on the Colo sign is being gathered.

In other business the council discussed purchasing a plow truck. More information is being gathered.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Stoeffler moved to adjourn. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
