February 7, 2018

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, February, 7, 2018, at City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor John Wilson. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Stoeffler, Spalding, Geisinger, Otto, Handsaker. Absent: none.

Council member Handsaker seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

An Instant Pot class is going to be held Tuesday, the 13th at 7:00 p.m.

Story County Sheriff, Nick Lennie presented to the council that the Sheriff's Office is raising money to be able to put AED's in every squad car. Fundraising events will begin soon. Two new deputies have been hired due to start in April. The Citizens Academy will be starting March 8th. Those interested need to contact the Sheriff's Office by February 20th to sign up.

The FYE 6-30-19 budget was discussed. All agreed more renovations on the Community Center is needed and a new or different plow truck is in need. More information is being gathered.

Council member Otto moved to approve the FYE 6-30-19 budget public hearing will be March 5, 2018 at 7:15 p.m. Council member Spalding seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Geisigner moved to approve the FYE 6-30-18 budget amendment public hearing will be March 5, 2018 at 7:20 p.m. Council member Otto seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Geisigner moved to approve the Law Enforcement Services contract for fiscal year 2019. Council Otto seconded the motion.

Council member Spalding moved to approve the drawings for a new Colo sign. Council member Otto seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Spalding moved to approve the purchase of a new lift station pump from Electric Pump. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Story County discussed hooking up Hickory Grove's waste water to the City of Colo lagoons. Story County offered to fund part of an engineering study on water infiltration.

The housing development was discussed. More information is being gathered.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Stoeffler moved to adjourn. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
