Council member Norgart seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The Council received reports from the Story County Sheriff's Department and the Colo Crossroads Festival Committee.

Council member Otto moved to approve a contract with Story County for law enforcement services. Council member Norgart seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Conrad moved to approve the appointment of Jeff Starnes to the Colo Zoning Board of Adjustment to fill a term ending 12-31-18. Council member Nichols seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

At 7:15 p.m. the Mayor declared that this was the time and the place for a public hearing on the city budget for the fiscal year ending 6-30-15. There were no comments received and the hearing was closed. Council member Norgart introduced and moved the approval of a RESOLUTION ADOPTING BUDGET AND CERTIFICATION OF CITY TAXES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2014 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2015. Council member Nichols seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes: Otto, Norgart, Nichols, Conrad. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted and he gave it No. 14-3-1 for the record.

Mayor Wilson welcomed the Colo Boy Scout Troop and their leaders.

Council member Milleson arrived at 7:18 p.m.

Council member Nichols moved to approve tax abatement for a new garage at 520 South St. Council member Milleson seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The Council discussed possible pay schedules for the city clerk/maintenance superintendent position.

The clerk reported that Central Iowa Water Association had inquired about the city receiving wastewater from the Hickory Grove Campground. The council directed the clerk to advise CIWA that the city would be willing to expand the existing wastewater treatment agreement with CIWA subject to acceptable terms and conditions.

The Council reviewed information provided by ISU extension regarding the emerald ash borer. The city will be receiving a detailed tree inventory from the state urban forester. The inventory will identify the quantity and location of ash trees in the city so that planning and policies can be established regarding the emerald ash borer.

The clerk gave a report on a recent meeting of the Colo Community Visioning Steering Committee. The committee discussed the proposed trail to Hickory Grove Park, Arbor Day plans, and future plans for the continued improvement of the main street pocket park and the "slab" area.

The clerk provided information regarding possible property line conflicts at the baseball field located at First and South Streets. Council member Milleson moved to authorize the city clerk to negotiate with the property owners adjacent to the baseball field to resolve property line conflicts. Council member Norgart seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The Council resumed discussion of the pay schedule for the city clerk/maintenance superintendent position. Mayor Wilson directed the committee (Nichols, Milleson) to meet and bring back proposals to the next regular meeting for full council consideration.

There being no further business to come before the meeting Council member Norgart moved to adjourn. Council member Conrad seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
