March 7, 2016

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, March 7, at City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor John Wilson. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows:

Present: Conrad, Geisinger, Otto, Nichols. Absent: Milleson.

Council member Otto moved to approve the minutes of the February 1, 2016 regular meeting as presented.

Council member Nichols seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Conrad seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Joanie Jamison from the Colo Public Library reported the city wide garage sale will be the weekend of June 10th and 11th.

Dennis Clatt from the Colo Fire Department reported there were twenty-five calls so far this year. The new attack truck is now in the department's possession. The department's EMS completed a state audit this past month.

Andrew Boeckman from the Story County Sheriff's Office gave a report.

Clerk Kohlwes has received reports on neighborhood dogs barking. It was agreed by the council if it were to continue further action would be taken in the matter.

At 7:15 p.m. the Mayor declared that this was the time and the place for a public hearing on the city budget for fiscal year ending 6-30-17. There were no comments received and the hearing was closed. Council member Otto introduced and moved for approval of a RESOLUTION ADOPTING BUDGET AND CERIFICATION OF CITY TAXES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2016 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2017. Council member Conrad seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes, Nichols, Otto, Geisinger, Conrad. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted and he gave it 16-3-1 for the record.

Council member Nichols moved to approve the Law Enforcement Services contract with the Story County Sheriff's Office for 2017. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Conrad moved to approve the Dog House's request for street closures for events on June 18, July 9, and August 27. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Nichols moved to approve the property tax abatement application for Ben and Heather Spalding's garage at 603 First Street. Council member Otto seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Clayton Miller's request for a zoning statement for recyclers permit was discussed. It was agreed that he has not complied with the city on the issue.

Discussions on Central Iowa Water wanting to hook up the Hickory Grove Park and the Country Living Estates to the city's lagoon. The council decided it wasn't a good idea to do this.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Conrad moved to adjourn. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
