April 1, 2019

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, April 1, 2019 at City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor John Wilson. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Stoeffler, Spalding, Geisinger, Otto and Handsaker. Absent: none

Council member Stoeffler seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Story County Sheriff, Jordan Lenz said thefts are increasing. Citizens need to keep things locked up.

Librarian, Joanie Jamison said the month of April is very busy month. National Library week is coming up along with the Easter activities scheduled for April 21st.

Fire Chief, Dennis Clatt discussed parking lot quotes. More information is being gathered. Kevin Deaton of Feld Fire presented to the council information on new fire/ems vehicles. The ambulance is up for renewal. The council discussed options on purchasing a new or used vehicle. Clatt discussed a used ambulance. Council member Stoeffler moved to approve Clatt the authority to purchase the used ambulance by putting budget funds towards the purchase. Council member Handsaker seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

At 7:15 the Mayor declared that this was the time and the place for a public hearing on the city budget amendment for fiscal year ending 6-30-19. There were no comments received and the hearing was closed. Council member Spalding introduced and moved the approval of a RESOLUTUION ADOPTING BUDGET AMENDMENT AND CERTIFICATION OF CITY TAXES FOR FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2018 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2019. Council member Otto seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes: Geisinger, Otto, Handsaker. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution was adopted and he gave it 19-4-1 for the record.

The housing development was discussed.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Handsaker moved to adjourn. Council member Spalding seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
