

Proceedings of the Colo City Council
April 2, 2012

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, April 2, 2012, at City Hall. Mayor John Wilson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Day, Norgart, Peakin, Patrick. Absent: Woods.

Council member Norgart moved to approve the minutes of the March 5, 2012, meeting as presented. Council member Peakin seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Norgart seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The Council received reports from the Story County Sheriff's Office, Colo Fire and Rescue, Colo Recreation Board, and the Colo Crossroads Festival Committee.

Betty Boccella of Central Iowa RSVP presented information regarding management for volunteers during a disaster. Trained RSVP volunteers operate a non-emergency Phone Bank and staff an all-Volunteer Reception Center where all volunteers are registered, given proper ID and assigned to disaster-related tasks as directed. RSVP will be seeking volunteers in Colo who would be willing to go through training in order to assist in the event of a disaster in the Colo area.

The Council received a resignation from Marlin Beard from the Colo Recreation Board.

Council member Day moved to appoint Stacie Hostetler to the Colo Recreation Board with a term ending 12-31-13. Council member Norgart seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

At 7:40 p.m. Council member Woods arrived and Council member Norgart left the meeting.

The Council reviewed a proposed agreement for the operation of the Colo Cemetery by a joint board composed of representatives of the City of Colo and New Albany and Sherman townships. The council directed the clerk to forward the agreement to the township trustees for consideration after review by the city attorney.

Council member Day moved to approve funding for the Colo Crossroads Festival Committee in the amount of \$2000.00. Council member Woods seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Woods moved to set the date of May 7, 2012, at 7:15 p.m. for a public hearing on an amendment to the Colo Urban Revitalization Plan. Council member Day seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The Council reviewed progress to date on the Colo Community Visioning Program. The next meeting of the Steering Committee will be May 3, 2012, at 5:30 p.m. at City Hall. At that meeting the Committee will review data from March 24 and 31 focus group, special places mapping, and visual quality assessments and create and prioritize a list of projects. Citizens are invited and encouraged to attend.

There being no further business to come before the meeting Council member Day moved to adjourn. Council member Patrick seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
