

Proceedings of the Colo City Council
May 4, 2015

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, May 4, 2015, at City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor John Wilson. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows:

Present: Otto, Geisinger, Nichols, Conrad, Milleson. Absent: None.

Council member Conrad moved to approve the minutes of the April 6, 2015, meeting as presented. Council member Nichols seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Nichols seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Nichols gave an update on the Colo Crossroads Festival celebration. Events are starting to come together and volunteers are still needed. The Boot Heel Saloon requested street closures for the street dance. Deputy Quinn gave an update on law enforcement. Deputies have been in town more frequently this month due to burning issues and more patrolling.

Council member Otto introduced a RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND EXECUTING A TITLE VI NON-DISCRIMINATION AGREEMENT. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed record vote: Conrad, Nichols, Geisinger, Otto, Milleson. Nays: none. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted and he gave it No. 15-5-1 for the record.

Council member Conrad moved to approve a liquor license for The Boot Heel Saloon. Council member Milleson seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Milleson moved to approve the Kaufman building permit. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Milleson moved to approve funding of \$1,000.00 or less to Keep Iowa Beautiful. Seconded by council member Conrad and it passed all ayes. The Clerk stated this is an economic movement for all of Story County in which every City will be involved throughout the county.

The clerk gave an update on the street improvement project. The sidewalks on South Street have been completed along with dirt work and seeding has begun.

Mark Wieland, President of the Leathernecks Motorcycle club discussed street closures with the council for a benefit ride taking place on June 27th. Council member Geisinger motioned to approve the closures, seconded by council member Milleson, it passed with all ayes.

Council member Nichols moved to approve street closures for Colo Crossroads Festival. Seconded by Conrad and it passed all ayes.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Milleson moved to adjourn. Council member Conrad seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
