The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, May 4, 2020 at the Community Center. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Arlo Starbuck. Council member Adams seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Fire Chief, Dennis Clatt informed the council of the departments changes due to Covid-19. The old ambulance has been sold and awaiting the new owner to pick up. The new garage door openers have been installed along with the new radios. The department has been doing drive by birthday celebrations along with participating in the community scoop the loop activities. Clatt is researching tanker trucks as one is up for renewal in 2022.

Council member Spalding moved to approve Casey's General Stores Cigarette Permit. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

At 7:15 the Mayor declared that this was the time and the place for a public hearing on the proposed budget amendment. There were no comments received and the hearing was closed. Council member Spalding introduced and moved the approval of the BUDGET AMENDMENT RESOLUTION. Council member Adams seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Adams, Handsaker, Stoeffler, Spalding, Geisinger. Nays: none. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution was adopted and he gave it 20-5-1 for the record.

Council member Geisinger moved to approve STREET LIGHT RESOLUTION to add two street lights to Progress Drive. Council member Adams seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Spalding moved to approve the bidding process for the Community Center renovations. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The council had discussions on Hickory Grove wanting to hook up to the city lagoon. Clerk Kohlwes is gathering information from the DNR.

The council discussed switching to Colo garbage cans instead of the Colo garbage bags. The council agreed they would like to get rid of the bags. More information is being gathered along with a flier will be sent to residents. The switch will not take place until fall.

The council discussed housing development options. More information is being gathered.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Stoeffler moved to adjourn. Council member Adams seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
