May 6, 2019

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, May 6, 2019 at City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor John Wilson. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Stoeffler, Geisinger, Otto and Handsaker. Absent: Spalding

Council member Otto moved to approve the minutes of the April 1, 2019 regular meeting as presented. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Stoeffler seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Librarian, Joanie Jamison announced the library has received two different STEM grants. The Library also sponsors the City-Wide garage sales that will be held June 14th and 15th.

Story County Sheriff, Jordan Lenz said things have been slow.

Fire Chief, Dennis Clatt stated the department purchased a new ambulance. They will be accepting sealed bids for the old one.

Colo-NESCO Superintendent, Jim Walker presented the council with the ING Architects review of the all the school buildings. Community meetings will be held to inform the public. ADA compliance and Safety are his biggest concerns.

At 7:15 the Mayor declared that this was the time and the place for a public hearing on the city budget amendment for fiscal year ending 6-30-19. There were no comments received and the hearing was closed. Council member Otto introduced and moved the approval of a RESOLUTION ADOPTING BUDGET AMENDMENT AND CERTIFICATION OF CITY TAXES FOR FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2018 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2019. Council member Handsaker seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes: Geisinger, Otto, Handsaker, Stoeffler. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution was adopted and he gave it 19-5-1 for the record.

Council member Stoeffler moved to approve the Dog House's outdoor sales for June 22nd. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Otto moved to approve RESOLUTION WAIVING THE RIGHT TO REVIEW SUBDIVISION. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes: Geisinger, Otto, Handsaker, Stoeffler. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution was adopted and he gave it 19-5-2 for the record.

Council member Otto moved to approve RESOLUTION AMENDING THE FINAL PLAT OF OSTEM-SCOTT ADDITION (HARVEST ACRES). Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes: Geisinger, Otto, Handsaker, Stoeffler. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution was adopted and he gave it 19-5-3 for the record.

Council member Otto moved to approve the DOT to do soil samples on City property. Council member Handsaker seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Discussions of the Fire Department parking lot was tabled to the next meeting.

Discussions of the City Hall shop floor was tabled to the next meeting.

Council member Stoeffler moved to approve the city code that states "No owner shall keep a vicious animal with in the City" for the County deemed vicious dog at 620 Main Street. Council member Handsaker seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The housing development was discussed. The council is making an offer on Jeslyn Jackson's property.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Stoeffler moved to adjourn. Council member Otto seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
