

Proceedings of the Colo City Council
May 7, 2018

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, May 7, 2018, at City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor John Wilson. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Stoeffler, Spalding, Geisinger, Otto. Absent: Handsaker.

Council member Otto moved to approve the minutes of the April 2, 2018 regular meeting and April 17, 2018 special meeting as presented. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Stoeffler seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Doug Harding of the Ragbrai Committee asked the council to revise the previous Ragbrai ordinance. The committee received a \$2,000.00 grant from Story County to help pay for expenses. The theme is "Where's Colo?" An informational meeting will be held on May 9th at 7:00 p.m. at the Colo Community Center.

Council member Otto introduced and moved the approval amending the current RAGBRAI Ordinance. Council member Spalding seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Geisinger introduced and moved the approval of a RESOLUTION APPOINTING REPRESENTATIVE TO THE STORY COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT GROUP Council member Spalding seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes Stoeffler, Spalding, Geisinger, and Otto. Nays: none. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution was adopted and he gave it 18-5-1 for the record.

Colo Librarian, Joanie Jamison said the City-Wide Garage Sales will be help June 1st and 2nd. This event is sponsored by the Library. The Library is gearing up for the summer reading program. It will be Wednesday nights from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. The Library will be hosting a "Family Fun Night" at the Colo Central Park on July 6th for the kick off of the Crossroads Festival. There will be several things going on: clown, face painting, rock climbing, prince and princess crowning, a mom calling contest and a bike rodeo. The roof on the building has been completed and looks great. The library is also wanting to have a write-up on the City newsletter on all City Council members and City employees.

Officer Nick Lennie from the Story County Sheriff's Office stated last months child abduction training was successful and received great feedback. The county's armored vehicle will be on display for RAGBRAI as it comes through town.

Fire Chief, Dennis Clatt stated the department has had 10 fires and 14 rescues. The department used their new Lucas device and it saved a person's life.

The new sump pump ordinance was discussed. The city is paying for all inspections.

The fire department parking lot was discussed. All agreed to having Con-Struct regrade the parking lot and surroundings to help with water drainage. The sewer line leading into the building is very shallow. Clerk Kohlwes is checking into the price of moving the line in a different direction.

The housing development was discussed. The council would like an exact breakdown of expenses of the project. More information is being gathered.

Other water problem areas were discussed. The council talked about putting the swale back along Fifth Street just south of Main Street. Clerk Kohlwes is gathering more information.

Council member Spalding moved to approve the hiring of Stephanie Woodhouse for the replacement of the City Hall retiring secretary as well as a children's librarian at the Library.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Stoeffler moved to adjourn. Council member Handsaker seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
