

Proceeding of the Colo City Council Meeting
June 18, 2018

The Colo City Council met in a special session on Monday, June 18, 2018 at City Hall. Mayor John Wilson called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. The roll was called showing all members present and absent as follows: Present: Handsaker, Stoeffler, Spalding, and Geisinger. Absent: Otto.

Council member Geisinger moved to approve the third reading of the Sump Pump ordinance. Council member Spalding seconded the motion and it passed all ayes. With this ordinance the City will hire two plumbers to do the inspections. If the inspector finds a problem then the council agreed to pay half of the repairs up to \$250.00. If the citizen uses a different plumber than the city hired a reinspection will need to be done. All inspections will begin August 1, 2018. Sump lines can go to the storm sewer or be day lighted.

Council member Spalding moved to approve the third reading of the RAGBRI ordinance. Council member Handsaker seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Stoeffler introduced and moved the approval of a RESOLUTION APPOINTING STEPHANIE WOODHOUSE TO THE CITY BANK ACCOUNTS. Council member Geisinger seconded it and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes: Stoeffler, Spalding, Geisinger, Handsaker. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution was adopted and he gave it 18-6-4 for the record.

City owned property was discussed. More information is being gathered.

The housing development was discussed. More information is being gathered.

In other business the council discussed the purchase of a newer snow plow/dump truck. The truck should be ready by September. The council also discussed the moving of the fire station sewer line. There is not enough fall to move the line deeper so other options are being made to leave the line where it currently is. Council member Spalding is gathering more information.

Fire Chief, Dennis Clatt, informed the council on a demo ambulance. The cost of an ambulance is \$170,000. The council agrees the department needs to be charging for transport. More information is being gathered.

There being no further business to come before the meeting the Council member Geisinger moved to adjourn. Council member Handsaker seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
