

Proceedings of the Colo City Council
July 2, 2012

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, July 2, 2012, at City Hall. Mayor John Wilson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. It was noted that Paul R. Conrad was took the oath of office for a city council member position prior to the meeting. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Peakin, Patrick, Conrad, Woods. Absent: Norgart.

Council member Woods moved to approve the minutes of the June 4, 2012, meeting as presented. Council member Peakin seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Patrick seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The Council received reports from the Story County Sheriff's Office, Colo Fire and Rescue, Colo Crossroads Festival Committee, and the Colo Recreation Board.

At 7:15 p.m. the Mayor announced that this was the time and the place for a public hearing to comments for or against an ordinance providing for building numbering. There were no comments received and the hearing was closed.

At 7:16 p.m. the Mayor announced that this was the time and the place for a public hearing to comments for or against an ordinance regulating garage and yard sales. There were no comments received and the hearing was closed.

Council member Conrad introduced an ORDINANCE REGULATING GARAGE AND YARD SALES. And moved its approval on second reading. Council member Woods seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes: Peakin, Woods, Conrad, Patrick. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance approved on second reading.

Council member Woods introduced an ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF COLO, IOWA, 2007, BY ADDING A NEW ARTICLE PROVIDING FOR BUILDING NUMBERING and moved its approval on second reading. Council member Peakin seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes: Woods, Conrad, Patrick, Peakin. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and ordinance approved on second reading.

Sixth Street from Main Street to South Street – 10:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m.

Sixth Street from Bailey Street to Voorhies Street – 11:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Bailey Street from Fifth Street to Sixth Street – 11:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Fifth Street from Bailey Street to Voorhies Street - 11:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Voorhies Street from Fourth Street to Sixth Street - 11:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Collins Street from Warner Street to North Third Street – 6:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Council member Woods seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The Council reviewed request to abandon a section of sidewalk on the west side of 417 Voorhies Street.

Council member Peakin moved to approve the removal and abandonment of the section of sidewalk on the west side of 417 Voorhies St. Council member Patrick seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Norgart arrived at 7:30 p.m.

Council member Woods moved to approve a contract with Story County for Animal Rescue Services. Council member Norgart seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The Council received an update on the Community Visioning Project. There will be meetings on the visioning projects on July 16, at 5:30 p.m. at City Hall, July 23, at 5:30 p.m. at the Community Center and July 30, at 5:30 p.m. at City Hall.

Council member Peakin moved to approve the resignation of Jon Cutler from the Colo Recreation Board and the appointment of Amy Kohlwes to the Colo Recreation Board with a term ending 12-31-13. Council member Conrad seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

There being no further business to come before the meeting Council member Peakin moved to adjourn. Council member Norgart seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
