August 1, 2016

Council member Otto seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Joanie Jamison from the Colo Public Library said the summer reading was a success. Jamison received bids to replace the retaining wall along the back side of the building. Angell Landscaping will be doing the work. The library has a new look to the interior of the building.

Dennis Clatt, Fire Chief gave a report on the fire department. The department received a Prairie Meadows grant in the amount of \$5,000. Money is going to be spent on a commercial washing machine for washing fire gear.

Brett Sink from the Story County Sheriff's office gave a report.

At 7:15 p.m. the Mayor declared that this was the time and the place for a public hearing on the appointment of the open City Council position. There were no comments received and the hearing was closed.

Council member Otto moved to approve the appointment of Ben Spalding to the open City Council seat. Council member Geisinger approved the motion and it passed all ayes.

Bonnie Florke was here to represent the Colo senior citizens. Heartland Senior Services is no longer providing congregate meals. Discussions with other meal providers have been made. More information is being gathered.

The council discussed ideas on a housing development. More information is being gathered.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Conrad moved to adjourn. Council member Spalding seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
