August 5, 2019

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, August 5, 2019 at City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor John Wilson. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Stoeffler, Geisinger, Otto and Handsaker. Absent: Spalding

Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Story County Sheriff, Nathan Gruis said the county has a new speed trailer. The council agreed it needs to be placed on West Street at the beginning of school. The council discussed on getting flashing speed signs for South and West Street.

Librarian, Joanie Jamison said there was a great crowd for the drive-thru of the Big Boy steam engine. The library served hot dogs and chips for the event. There are no children's events going on in August but they will start back up in September. Jamison expressed the lack of community involvement. The council agreed this is a problem and they are going to start brainstorming ideas to draw people in.

Fire Chief, Dennis Clatt said the new ambulance is in service. He has proceeded with scheduling the parking lot paving.

Council member Otto moved to approve the liquor license for Casey's General Stores. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Geisinger introduced and moved the approval of RESOLUTION OF ADOPTING THE STORY COUNTY MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL LOCAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN. Council member Handsaker seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes: Stoeffler, Geisinger, Otto and Handsaker. Nays: none. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution was adopted and he gave it 19-8-1.

Council member Stoeffler moved to approve the bid from Hensley Concrete Coatings Inc. to seal the shop floor. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The housing development was discussed. More information is being gathered.

In other business, Mayor Wilson attended an Alliant Energy meeting. He discussed looking into solar panels. More information is being gathered.

The owner of the Colo Bar asked the council about providing a handicap parking spot. All agreed we could make a handicap spot on the west side of the building. Clerk Kohlwes will speak with him.

Colo-NESCO Superintendent, Jim Walker presented the council with information on the newly formed task force. The task force is coming up with a plan identifying the needs for all the school properties and how to pay for it.

The Dog House had a representative asking the council if they could install a patio in the front of the bar that would provide outdoor seating. The council thought it would be a great idea. Some of the parking spots may be changed around a bit once it's finished.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Stoeffler moved to adjourn. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
