

Proceeding of the Colo City Council Meeting  
August 20, 2018

The Colo City Council met in a special session on Monday, August 20, 2018 at City Hall. Mayor John Wilson called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. The roll was called showing all members present and absent as follows: Present: Otto, Handsaker, Stoeffler, Spalding, and Geisinger. Absent: none.

The council discussed the Wilson Auction property. All agreed an estimate on tearing the building down, asbestos and other hazardous testing needs to be done. No decisions will be made until this is done. Brenda Dyer from Story County stated there are grants available to help with deconstruction. Fred Cerka from the Colo Historical Association asked the council if a building could be shared with the Association and the City. More information is being gathered.

Utility billing was discussed on if we continue not charging the churches utilities. The council agreed neither of the churches used enough water to worry about. Clerk Kohlwes will start doing utility billing reconciling.

The council discussed City owned property. Construction on the outside of the Library/Community Center will begin in a few weeks. Estimates on windows, doors and insulation are being gathered.

The new City sign was discussed as the sign is almost complete. All agreed there would be two lights per side along with a light on the flag.

Council member Spalding introduced and moved the approval of a RESOLUTION TRANSFERING FUNDS FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING 6-30-18. Council member Stoeffler seconded the motion and it passed with record vote as follows: Ayes: Stoeffler, Spalding, Geisinger, Otto, and Handsaker. Nays: none. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution was adopted and he gave it 18-8-1 for the record.

Council member Stoeffler moved to approve the purchase of an 11-foot snowplow for the new plow truck. Council member Spalding seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

The housing development was discussed. More information is being gathered.

In other business the council discussed writing an ordinance on the number of cars homeowners can have in their yard. More information is being gathered.

There being no further business to come before the meeting the Council member Spalding moved to adjourn. Council member Stoeffler seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
