

5Proceedings of the Colo City Council  
December 5, 2016

The Colo City Council met in regular session on Monday, December 5, 2016, at City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor John Wilson. The roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Conrad, Otto, Geisinger. Absent: Nichols and Spalding.

Council member Conrad moved to approve the minutes of the November 7, 2016 regular meeting and of the November 17, 2016 special meeting as presented. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Conrad seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Dennis Clatt from the Colo Fire Department gave a report. 804 has been repaired with new tires and alignment. The new attack truck will be in service in January.

Joanie Jamison from the Colo Public Library gave a report. The Library will be serving chili with live holiday music on December 16, 2016. Christmas in Colo is this weekend. The library is hosting a ginger bread house contest.

Officer Sink from the Story County Sheriff's office reported there has been someone stealing Christmas decorations in town and surrounding towns. He stated no one has been caught.

Citizen, Mary Jo Starnes, discussed with the council the problem of barking dogs in her neighborhood. Officer Sink said there have been many reports of the dogs barking. He said the sheriff's office now has enough evidence to issue an infraction if the barking continues. He is going to visit with the citizen of the barking dog.

Council member Otto moved to approve Stephanie Woodhouse to the Colo Rec Board. Council member Geisinger seconded the motion and it passed all ayes.

Council member Geisinger introduced RESOLUTION APPROVING SUPPORT OF THE STORY COUNTY/MUNICIPAL FIRE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT. Council member Conrad seconded the motion and it passed record vote: Geisinger, Otto, and Conrad. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution was adopted and he gave it No 16-12-1.

The council discussed the possibility of allowing UTV's and ATV's to be ridden within the City. All agreed a yearly registration fee and sticker would be given to those wanting to ride their UTV or ATV. Proof of insurance will also be required. More information is being gathered.

Discussions on the housing development were made. A meeting with the prospective developer is scheduled for December 12, 2016.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Council member Geisinger moved to adjourn. Council member Conrad seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
